

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Ana Martínez Fernández (1982), based in Madrid studied at UPV (Bilbao) and Goldsmiths College (London). Her sculpture based work examines the ambivalence of representation of images by exploring the vulnerability of mechanisms of desire. Previous exhibitions include S12iS12iS12i2iS12i2iS1, Aparador Monteleón (Madrid), 2021; La más mala, supermala.europe, 2020; sueño>suelo, Salón (Madrid) 2019, Tongue finishes back at the root of itself, Pehu (Osaka) 2019. She is also curating Pradera, an independent exhibition space where she is producing exhibitions as well as other formats of artistic interchange.

His most recent solo and duo exhibitions include "Of gardens and castles and borders and playgrounds" at New Jörg (Vienna) 2019, "Demolished Beauty", curated by Alexandra-Maria Toth, Spouse (Mallorca) 2019, and "Cruel Summer Camp", Exile (Vienna) 2020

Belén Rodríguez is Magister Art by the Accademy of Fine Arts in Vienna and Universidad Complutense de Madrid. She has participated in Artist in Residence Programmes such as Flora ars + natura in Bogota, Artista X Artista in Havana, Hooper Projects in Los Angeles, Academia de España in Rome and BMUKK in Tokyo. She received the Premio Generaciones in 2011 and its Honourable Mention in 2009, the First Prize Ciutat de Palma Antoni Gelabert in 2013, and the Staatsipendium grant from the Austrian Ministry of Culture in 2015, among others. Her work can currently be seen at the 8 Biennale Internationale d'Art Contemporain d'Anglet, France and she is preparing three site-specific projects for the exhibition Textiles, at CAAC in Seville, in 2021, the group exhibition curated by Chus Martínez for Collegium in Arévalo (Ávila) and the solo exhibition for La Capilla in Patio Herreriano in 2022.
